fair organization so that all may grow.

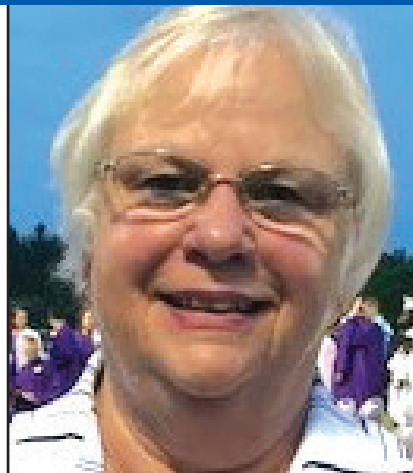

In the past four years, we have made remarkable changes to how the Village of Sodus operates. Whether you live here, own and operate a business here, work here, shop here, or are merely passing through, we want your time in our village to be as pleasant and memorable as possible. This means that we have tackled some difficult and persistent issues, such as drainage, street and sidewalk rehabilitation, and lighting to name a few.

Accomplishments

- Converting our dull sodium-vapor streetlights into new, energy efficient LED lights
- The Mill Street Renovation Project
- The Maple Avenue Railroad Crossing Project (jointly with the Ontario Midland Railroad)

And that's only what you can see. Beneath the ground, we have also made countless repairs and

upgrades to our water, sewer, and drainage systems.

More good things are on the horizon!

- Before the year is out, much needed drainage work will take place on State Street.
- By early next year, we should witness the demolition of the 1812 Hotel, with site cleanup taking place through 2022 and commercial development taking place by 2023.
- Next summer will see the Union Street Renovation Project

As a lifelong resident of Sodus and the third generation of my family to live on Mill Street, I am invested in the village. When I was growing up, my mother was Village Clerk. In the 1930's my grandparents started their GLF business on the street, so my family history is tied to the village history.

After retiring from my teaching career, I attended village board meetings and served on the village planning board for a few years. I attended many municipal trainings and earned 45 credit hours, in addition to 4 days of training in the state conference in 2019.

For the last four years as village trustee, I have also served on the Sodus Climate Smart Task

Force. Our group has been awarded grants to make the Village of Sodus a green community. While serving on the board, the mayor, the other trustees, and I are updating our infrastructure by improving streets, sidewalks, and our drainage system. We have also restructured our work force to be more efficient and productive. We are also looking for ways to attract business to bring back our village to the premier community it was during its incorporation in 1918 and the years that followed that I remember as I was growing up.

Community

I am also a member of several community groups including the Sodus Chamber of Commerce, the Town of Sodus Historical Society (President), the Friends of the Library (President), the Sodus Farmers' Market Team, and the Sodus United Third Methodist Church.
